## LINCOLN PARK MOTALA

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**Sunday, September 15**

We're beating the heat again this month with an early morning start at Tucson's Lincoln Park. The three courses (beginner, intermediate and advanced levels) will use motala format. Those of you who missed the meet at Cottonwood last May may be wondering: What's a Motala?

Instead of one single large loop per course, a motala course is made up of a series of small loops, all of which begin and end at a common point. At this common point, participants will successively exchange maps for each of the loops on their course. The order of the loops will be randomly assigned to each entry. All entrants start at the same time but you won't know whether you are ahead or behind the other people on your course since everyone runs the loops in a different order.

If this is starting to sound confusing, just think of it as a regular course broken up into smaller sections. Motala courses are ideal for small sites such as our city parks and the early mass start is designed to avoid those

warm afternoon temperatures. Beginners are welcome and entries can be either recreational or competitive. If you miss the mass start, you can still run the course but controls will be removed at noon. Call Meet Director Dale Bruder at 323-7029 for further information or to volunteer to help at the meet.

**TIMES:** Registration will be open from 7:45 - 8:45 a.m. Beginner's Clinic will start at 8 a.m. There will be a briefing for all participants at 8:45 a.m. All courses will have a mass start at 9:00 a.m. Courses will close at noon.

**DIRECTIONS:** Enter Lincoln Park on the east side of Pantano Road, between Escalante and Irvington Roads and at the south side of Santa Rita High School. The course start will be near the trailhead at the east end of the parking lot, near the rest rooms.

**FEES:** \$4 for individuals, \$8 for teams with \$1 discount for TOC members. Compass rental available for \$1. Whistles should be carried by participants and can be purchased for \$1.

# A Great Day at Palisades!

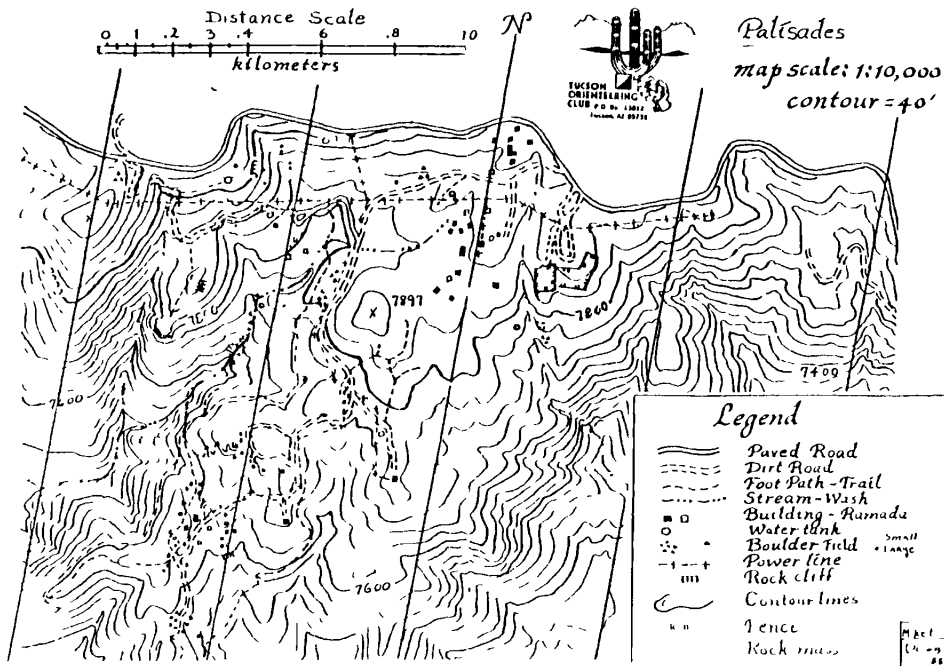
