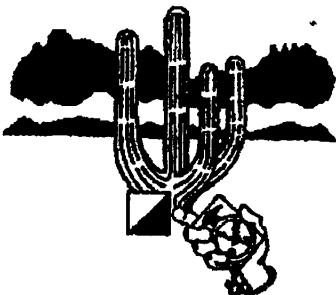

Bear Wallow in July

Join us on the 16th of July at High (8000 ft.), Cool (20-30° cooler than Tucson!) Bear Wallow in the Catalina Mountains. The terrain is very steep, open pine forest, but not a lot of brush. There are lots of old trails and roads running through the courses, but expect to be working some steep side hills, so hiking boots are recommended for good traction. There will be four courses from which to choose: White, Orange, Green, and Red.

As usual, volunteers are needed to help at the start/finish tables and with control retrieval. Call meet director Clark Lohr at 298-8290 to volunteer.

Camping: This is National Forest, open for camping. No facilities, but great campsites under the pines. No fees or reservations required.

Directions: Take Catalina Highway approximately 21 miles to Mt. Bigelow Road, about a mile past Palisades Ranger Station. (You may want to stop to use the bathrooms across from the Palisades Visitor Center. There are no facilities at the O site.) Turn right on Mt. Bigelow Road and look for TSN signs. You will go approximately 1/4 mile to the first junction, near the observatory entrance. Park along road. Registration is in a clearing 100 meters downhill (east-northeast) from the entrance.

Schedule:

- 9:00 a.m. Registration opens.
- 9:30 a.m. Courses open. Beginners' clinic starts.
- 12:00 noon Last time to start a course.
- 2:00 p.m. Courses close. Participants aim to check in by this time.
- 2:00 p.m. Control retrieval gets underway. Good practice in orienteering—lots of help always needed. Volunteer before 2 p.m. with the meet director.

To insure that all are safe, *everyone, whether finished with the course or not*, must check in formally at Start/Finish before leaving the meet site.

Newcomers: Check in at the Registration Table and tell them you are entering for the first time. They will give you additional information. To allow time to register before attending the beginners' clinic, you should arrive between 9 and 9:15 a.m.

Cost: \$5/individual, \$7/team; \$2 discount for TSN Club and USOF members. Compasses rent for \$1. Safety whistles sell for \$1. *Every person, all courses, all meets* is required to have some type of safety whistle.

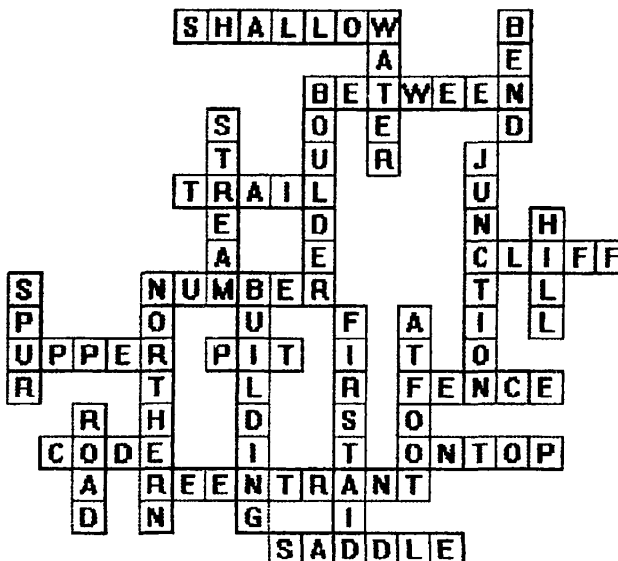
