

### PALISADES RIDGE, August 19-20

The entire Showers Point Group Campsite in the Catalinas has been reserved for us to camp Saturday and orienteer Sunday. At more than 7000 feet in elevation, we'll have a pleasant weekend no matter what the weather in Tucson. Showers Point has three pavilions with tables and fireplaces, plenty of large tent pads, and good toilet facilities.

Trails and roads of the various camps criss-cross Organization Ridge. The terrain varies from undulating to very steep, and we'll be running through open pine forest for the most part.

The Palisades map is scaled 1:10,000 and both the White (Basic) course and the Orange (Intermediate) course will be run on the more level part of the ridge. The Green (Advanced) course will be a bit more challenging, so be sure to come properly equipped. This could mean asbestos suits and ventilators - as I can see several fires in the mountains as I write this.

This is a good opportunity to take advantage of the facility. Also a good time to volunteer with some of the chores. Call meet director Tim Ward (327-3637) for questions or offers.

Camping: Camping available Saturday night at Showers Point Campground. Arrive after 1 pm on Saturday. See directions to meet site below.

Directions: Take Catalina Highway about 20 miles up to Organization Ridge Road. (Actually, it's only one mile up - the rest is horizontal). Turn left, and bearing right, go about 0.4 mile to the gate for Showers Point. The gate opens at 1:00 pm Saturday, and the campground hosts have extended our checkout time to 2:00 pm on Sunday.

#### Schedule:

9:00 a.m. Registration opens.

9:30 a.m. Courses open. Beginners' clinic starts.

12:00 noon Last time to start a course.

2:00 p.m. Courses close. Participants aim to check in by this time.

2:00 p.m. Control retrieval gets underway. Good practice in orienteering—lots of help always needed. Volunteer before 2 p.m. with the meet director.

To insure that all are safe, everyone, whether finished with the course or not, must check in formally at Start/Finish before leaving the meet site. TEAMS: All members must check in together.

Newcomers: When you arrive at the meet site, go to the Registration Table and tell them you are entering for the first time. You will be given introductory information. To allow time to register before attending the beginners' clinic, you should arrive between 9 and 9:15 a.m.

Cost: \$5/individual, \$7/team; \$2 discount for TSN, PHX, SAHC and USOF members. Compasses rent for \$1. Safety whistles sell for \$1. Every person, all courses, all meets is required to have some type of safety whistle.

Club Shirts: all cotton, several colors, medium, large, extra-large sizes; \$9 short sleeves, \$12 long sleeves. Available at most meets.

Lost and Found: Personal belongings left at a meet are collected and brought to later meets. Lost and Found. Check the Lost/Found basket near Registration.

# The 1995 Colorado 5-Day (er. 7-Day)

Colorado this year was much wetter than last; snow remained down to the 11,000 foot level on Pikes Peak (and the orienteering was at 8500 feet. No rafting on the Arkansas this year because it was running so high, but skiing was still available. The courses were much faster as were the orienteers. Still, some Tucson OC members had good performances; John Maier was 7th overall on the Red course, and 2nd in M45A; Mark Parsons 9th overall on the green course and 3rd in M50A. The Tucson relay team (Keith McLeod, Mark Parsons, Dan Cobbledick, Roger Sperline, and John Maier) finished 19th/40 entries (not bad considering the youngest runner on the team is 45 years old!) Competition in the relay included the British National Team; two teams from West Point; and other teams of elite and international competitors.

. The USOF convention was held this week, interleaved with the orienteering events. In addition to sessions on mapping course setting insurance, and other O-related topics, there were several presentations on fitness/training/nutrition, including one given by Peter Snell, former Olympic 800-meter champion (or was it 1500 meters??) and now avid orienteer.

# 1995 Arizona Championships

The 12th annual Arizona Championships will be hosted by the Tucson Orienteering Club on September 16 and 17. Orienteers of all skill levels are invited to attend. Participants in this years event will have those days count toward ranking days. It will be held in the Coronado National Forest around Rosemont Junction at the north end of the Santa Rita mountains.

Terrain: At 4200' elevation, this area is warm in September. Oak and mesquite abound in the complicated network of spurs and reentrants, saddles and hilltops. Animal trails and jeep roads are common, most of the area is runnable. Deer and cattle are common.

Map: Recently updated, 1:10,000 scale, 40 foot (12.5 m) contour lines. Courses not pre-printed. Courses: White (basic); Yellow (not yet intermediate); Orange (intermediate); Green (Advanced around 4 km); Red (around 7 km); Blue (longer yet) will be offered by veteran course setter Dan Cobbledick and vetted by Jeff Brucker. For Men, RED is the state championship course; for Womens, GREEN is the championship course. Call for more information on course lengths or other classes. Awards (mesquite medallions by Mark Parsons) will be awarded for a two day time total by gender and age group to individuals. Teams are welcome to participate as teams, but will not qualify for awards.

Camping: This is an unimproved site, though flat, shaded, and pleasant.

Lodging: Numerous motels available in Tucson (25 miles).

Directions: Take exit 281 (AZ 83) south from I-10 approximately 15 miles east of Tucson. Take 83 south for about eleven miles and look for the O signs on the west side of the road.

Saturday evening burbeque: A western style campfire dinner (bring your own chair and plate) will be served from 5-6 p.m. on Saturday by Mark. It will consist of steaks, chicken breasts, chili beans, tortillas, rolls, green and pasta salads, sodas and beer (donation per can).

Fees: Orienteering: \$6/person/day; \$3 if under 12 years old. \$8. teams (2 maps; \$1 extra per additional map) Discounts: \$1/person/day for TSN, PHX, USOF, IOF, or SAHC members. Barbeque: \$8/person for steak or chicken (please designate); \$6/person under 12 years; \$5/person meatless; \$4/person meatless, under 12 years.
