That second full moon is called a Blue Moon (anyone know why?) Hence the saying "Once in a blue moon...". Well, it seemed like a good reason to have an Orienteering Meet, and since its too hot to be out in the desert and July isn't a good time to be on the top of Mt. Lemmon (due to the frequency and severity of thundershowers), how about having our long-awaited NIGHT MEET? Meet at Ft. Lowell Park around 6:00 PM for a pot-luck dinner, the moon will rise at 7:47 to light up the course, and the adventure will begin.

Since the terrain is flat, a topo map isn't necessary, and since most of the controls will be in plain sight, the challenge to the course-setters is to create a challenging course. Here's what they came up with:

1. Competitors will be given course directions in the form of a list of compass bearings and distances. Following each bearing for the required distance will lead to the control.
2. Competitors will write the control code number or letter on their card.
3. Controls must be listed in the correct sequence for the card to be valid.

Sound easy? It is! Oh, but don't forget...the compass bearing might go through a wall or building that you will have to go around, also any ramada or play area that is reserved for other folks is off limits to us and will have to be circumnavigated. Also, we know how good you are getting so we are not above resorting to trickery, i.e., a control may be used twice but approached from different directions, there may be a "decoy" control that is in sight, but not used in the course, etc. You get the idea. Sounds like fun to me!! Se you there!
